He said: "It is vitally important to raise awareness through events such as Walk a Mile so that we can let carers know that they are not alone and that they have friends. There are people here in Swindon who might not even realise that they are carers. Swindon Carers Centre can help signpost carers to the support that is available locally.

"Carers are a part of a very large network, who without complaining, and without seeking praise, get on with the job of caring for their loved one."

News in brief

Trusted Charity

Carers are at the heart of everything we do and we are proud to have been reaccredited with a prestigious quality mark for the excellent service we provide.

The Trusted Charity Standard is a performance evaluation

system and quality mark. We were assessed against 11 quality areas within Level 1 and Level 2. All areas were considered by the



assessor to be impressively evidenced showing continuous improvement.

The award lasts three years and this is the fourth time Swindon Carers Centre has achieved it! Achieving this award helps our beneficiaries, commissioners, supporters, donors,

volunteers, staff and the public to have confidence that we always work to a high standard.

Emergency Card Scheme

In a previous edition of Caring Matters, we discussed the importance of regularly reviewing your Emergency Card plan. As a result, several carers contacted us with amendments to their plans and these amendments have been actioned. We would like to continue to encourage you to review your Emergency Card plans to ensure that they include accurate and up to date information.

In this edition we would like to remind our carers of how the Emergency Card Scheme operates.

It's available to all carers over the age of 18. The scheme relies on each carer being assigned a unique number, which is on your individual Emergency Card plan and your Emergency Card (the red card). In an emergency, someone (for example, a paramedic) can call the number on the red card and your Emergency Card plan will be activated so that whilst you are absent your dependent is cared for.

The scheme relies on each carer carrying



their red card all the time. We recently heard about a carer who had their red card in a kitchen drawer, so we'd like to encourage you to carry your red card at all times.

Please check your red card is in your wallet, purse or handbag. In the event that you have lost your red card, please contact us for a replacement.

Language Line

If English is not your spoken language, you can call Swindon Carers Centre and request an interpreter. This translation service is provided by Language Line Solutions and is

available during our normal working hours. Do you know someone who would benefit from this? To use this service, call our main number on (01793) 531133 and ask for the language line.

Grants for vocational training

If you are aged 16-24, live in Swindon and are starting a vocational course, training or apprenticeship in September, you can apply for a grant from Wiltshire Community Foundation.

Grants can be used towards:

- >>> Resources or equipment needed for the course, training or qualification
- >> Course-related study/field trips
- >> Travel costs in some circumstances
- >> IT equipment

Get help making an NHS complaint in Swindon

VoiceAbility

Whether you're a professional who knows something's not right, or you're not happy with your own experience, you can make an NHS complaints referral through VoiceAbility and get free, confidential support from an independent advocate to help you through the process.

Your complaint could be about the actions or decisions of any NHS staff member or organisation, including hospitals, GPs, dental surgeries, NHS-funded care homes or community care. You might want to complain about your care or treatment, waiting times,

communication, the information you were given or the attitude of staff.

An advocate can help you work out what you want to complain about, and what you'd like to happen next. They can help you prepare for a meeting, support you to write a complaints letter and understand the response. They're there to help you speak up for yourself.

Our impact during the last year

It has been another exceptionally busy year at Swindon Carers Centre. Our 2022 Annual General Meeting and the publication of our Annual Impact Review (2021-2022) gave us the opportunity to look back on our achievements and to share these with carers, volunteers and supporters.

Making a difference: Our year in figures



2,437 carers in total were supported by teams across Swindon Carers Centre.



685 young carers attended face-to-face activities organised by our Young Carers Team and 189 young carers attended termtime groups.

110 guests were invited to our Young Carer Champion Awards Celebrations. including YC Leads and young carers from 25 schools in Swindon.



Our Welfare and **Benefits Service** secured an estimated £234,982 in benefits and allowances for



We issued 252 new or reviewed Emergency Card Scheme plans for carers.



We answered 3,596 phone calls via our Carers Support Line

100% of carers attending adult carer activities, social events and wellbeing events report benefitting from these.



We referred carers to 114 different partner organisations, helplines and websites, for further support.

109 parent carers were supported during the past year, with



range of issues from homeschooling, decline in mental health to financial concerns.

The impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on unpaid carers and their families continues to be huge and the number of carers needing our support is increasing. Our key priorities for 2022/23 are:

- >> Continuing to keep carers at the heart of decision-making and ensuring their voice is heard.
- >> Developing a robust income generation plan that reduces our reliance on statutory funding.
- >> Increasing our reach to diverse groups (such as Asian carers).

Amy has been accepted to study a Master's course in Physicians Associate Studies at the University of the West of England in Bristol in September 2022. This Master's course is an exciting opportunity for Amy and I would like to wish her every success with this. Thank you Amy for all your hard work and dedication in your time with us.

Our team has had a very busy last quarter. From April to June we registered 118 new Adult and Older Carers, gave advice and support to 225 carers who called our Carer Support Line and signposted new carers to over 68 different partner organisations, help lines and websites. Our 1:1 practitioners supported 109 carers, carrying out full Carer's Conversations under the Care Act.

Tanya, our Health and Social Care Liaison Officer who lots of you talk to on the Carer Support Line, held a successful meeting with GP carers leads, which included discussing how GP surgeries can better identify and signpost carers to us. Please remember to let your GP know you are a carer for your dependent.

We have also been having regular weekly meetings with First City Brokerage to enable them and other partner agencies to understand your needs, especially the complexities of Carers Relief.

News from our Parent Carers Team

Our Parent Carer Support Practitioners, Lorraine and Isabel (pictured), attended the Transitions Roadshow meeting parent carers and other organisations.

The roadshow, held at Swindon Town Football Club in June, was for parents, carers and professionals who support young people aged 14+ with additional needs. Forty stallholders represented organisations from employment, training and volunteering, education and social care, health, voluntary sector services, community and sports activities.

They provided information and advice to help young people as they prepare for adulthood.

Lorraine said: "The roadshow was a huge success with a good turnout and a strong parent carer presence, which was really positive.

"We talked about what we do to support parent carers and also networked with the organisations which attended and made some useful contacts. Other services can refer parent carers to us, so it was good to inform and reiterate what we do and the work of Swindon Carers Centre in general in supporting unpaid carers.

"We were also able to signpost parent carers to other stallholders, which for lots of the visitors made it feel like a 'one stop shop' for them."

They abseiled off a tower, learned water rescue skills and climbed up to 32 metres on a ladder platform! They ended by demonstrating scenarios for their parents/quardians, including responding to a road traffic collision and a house fire, followed by a parade where they received their certificates.





Other activities enjoyed by our young carers have included Combat Splat and visiting Longleat.
